Consent for MRI

Magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) is a diagnostic method that uses a strong magnetic field to obtain two- and three-dimensional images of different areas of the body. MRI does not use X-rays.

When coming to the examination, please wear comfortable clothing without any metal parts (zippers, hooks, buttons). If necessary, we will provide you with disposable clothing. Metal jewellery, watches, dentures, mobile phones, and magnetic cards are not allowed in the examination room. You can store these items in the changing room.

Do not use hairspray, mascara or excessive make-up (especially if your head will be scanned) on the day of the examination.

The duration of the scan ranges between 20 to 60 minutes, depending on the area being examined. During this time, you must lie still on the examination table. A coil will be placed around the scanned area, and your position will be supported with cushions. You will then be moved into the MRI tunnel (diameter 80 cm), which is well-lit and open at both ends. The MRI machine will make loud sounds of varying intensity, so you will be given earplugs or headphones. You will also be given a safety button, which you can press to alert staff if you start to feel unwell. If necessary, the scan will be stopped. After the scan, you can leave and resume your normal daily activities. A radiologist will analyse the images and forward the result to your doctor.

If your examination requires the injection of a contrast agent, the radiology technician will insert a venous cannula before the scan to administer the contrast agent. The contrast agents are generally well tolerated and complications such as headaches are rare and not serious. You can continue taking your everyday medications and there are no restrictions on your diet. It is recommended to drink more fluids on the day of the scan and the following day.
